Information for candidates nominating for the position of a currently enrolled student of the Academy on the Western Australian Academy of Performing Arts Board.

Introduction

Qualifications

A candidate must be a currently enrolled student of the Western Australian Academy of Performing Arts. A candidate's principal employment (if any) must not be that of a member of staff of the University.

If the candidate who is elected to the WAAPA Board ceases to be a currently enrolled student of the Academy during the term of his or her Board membership, his or her membership of the Board will be terminated.

Term of office

The term of office will be from 1 January 2012 to 31 December 2012.

Important dates in 2011

Wed 14 Sept: nominations open

Wed 28 Sept noon: nominations close (noon)

Tues 18 Oct: polling day (8am to 6pm)

Counting of votes begins at 9am on Wed 19 Oct.

Nominations

Nomination forms may be obtained from the web http://www.ecu.edu.au/GPPS/governance_services/elections.html, from the Returning Officer (see details bottom right), or from Mrs Suzanne De Silva, Room 1.245, Mount Lawley Campus.

The closing date of nominations is 12 noon on Wednesday 28 September 2011.

Self nomination is permissible.

Nominations may be submitted by mail, by fax, or in person. Details are on the nomination form.

Candidates' details are confidential until the close of nominations.

Each candidate is advised to contact the Returning Officer prior to the closing date to confirm that his or her nomination has been received.

Ballot papers

Candidates appear on the ballot paper in the order established at the ballot draw. The ballot draw will be conducted at 10am on Thursday, 29 Sept 2011, and candidates will be notified of the draw result shortly thereafter by email.

Candidate biographies

Each candidate may lodge with his or her nomination a biography or election statement. This should be confined to a description of the candidate and his or her aims, objectives or policies. A 150-word limit applies.

Election statements

Candidates' biographies and contact details will be published as Election Statements. These will appear on notice boards and on the ECU website, and will be available to electors when voting.

Polling

In-person polling will take place near the Box Office in Building 1, Mount Lawley Campus, from 8am to 6pm on Tuesday 18 October 2011. Postal voting is not permitted.

Returning Officer

The Returning Officer appointed for this election is John Blahusiak, Senior Policy and Projects Officer in ECU's Governance Services (Joondalup Campus). The Returning Officer is responsible for the conduct of the election including:

- nominations;
- production and security of ballot papers;
- candidates' election statements;
- polling place arrangements;
- counting of the votes.
