As a Study Abroad or Exchange student you can study for one or two semesters at ECU as part of your degree in your home university.

Study Abroad and Exchange has many great benefits: it allows students to travel while they study, it widens students' horizons intellectually, socially and culturally; it provides an intellectual adventure and opportunities for personal growth; it improves future employment options; and it looks great on any resume!

By gaining prior approval from your home university, the study you complete in Australia may be credited back to your degree at home, so with careful planning you should be able to graduate on time.

Study Abroad or Exchange?

Tuition Fees

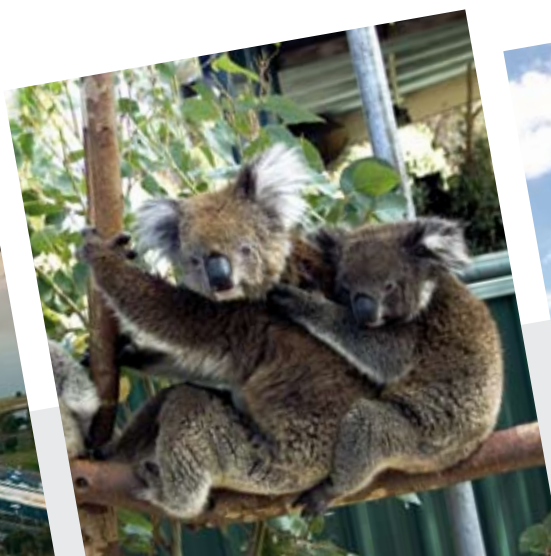
Exchange students continue paying their tuition fees to their home university while they are studying at ECU and therefore don't pay any tuition fees to ECU.

Study Abroad students pay a flat tuition fee per semester to ECU which is subject to annual change. The current fee (2010) is AUD\$8,500 per semester.

Please note certain units may have an additional fee attached. e.g. field trips, specific lab needs.

Study Abroad & Exchange Advisors

ECU has a team dedicated to the Study Abroad and Exchange program to assist students from the enquiry stage right through to acceptance and visa documentation. They assist students with enrolment prior to arrival at ECU, and provide ongoing support to students while they are studying in Australia.





CAMPUS LOCATIONS

Excellence in tertiary education has never been more accessible with fantastic transportation routes servicing our two metropolitan campuses in Mount Lawley and Joondalup. Our South West Campus is located in Bunbury, only two hours drive south of Perth.

Joondalup Campus

South West Campus (Bunbury)

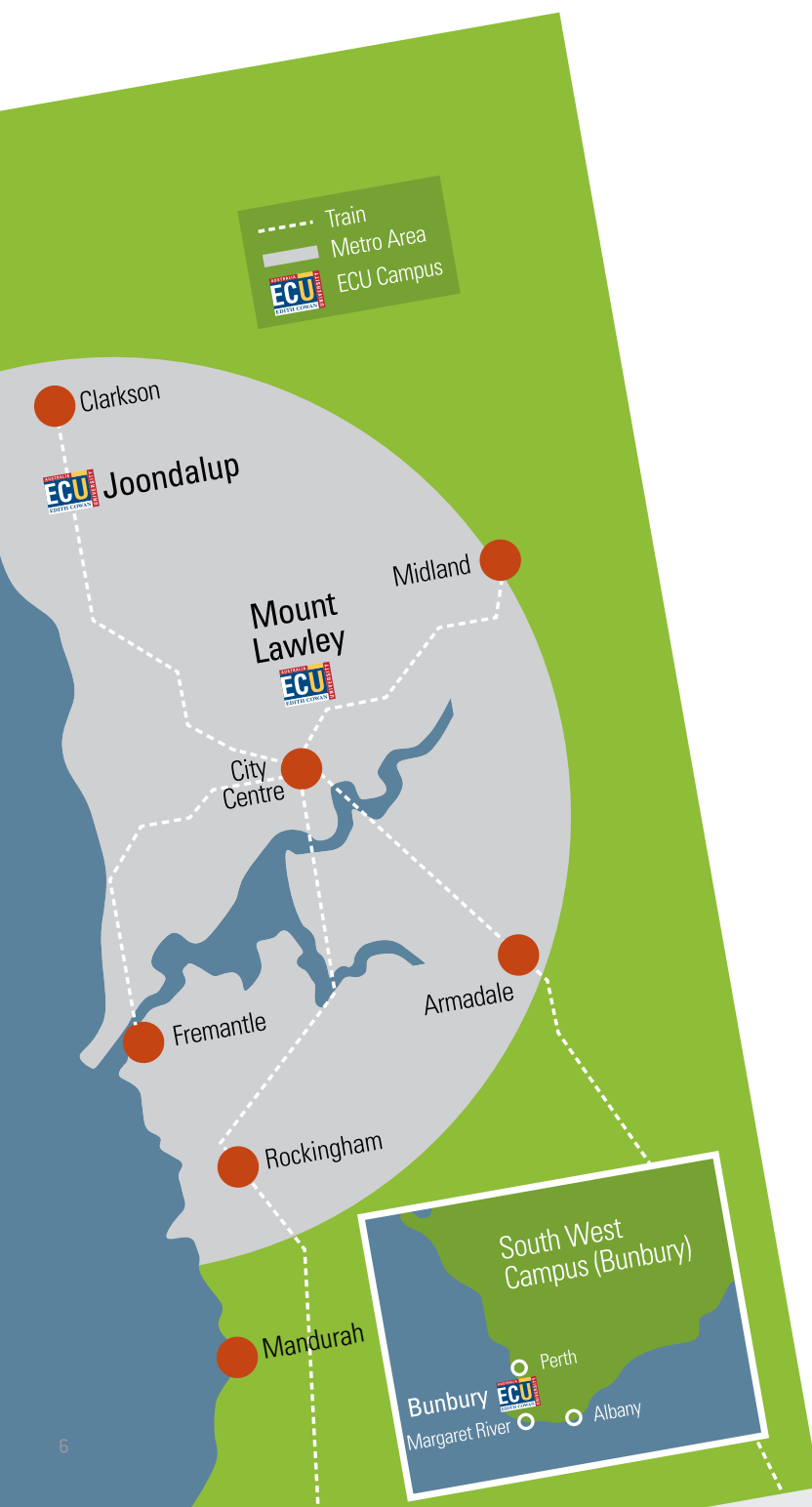

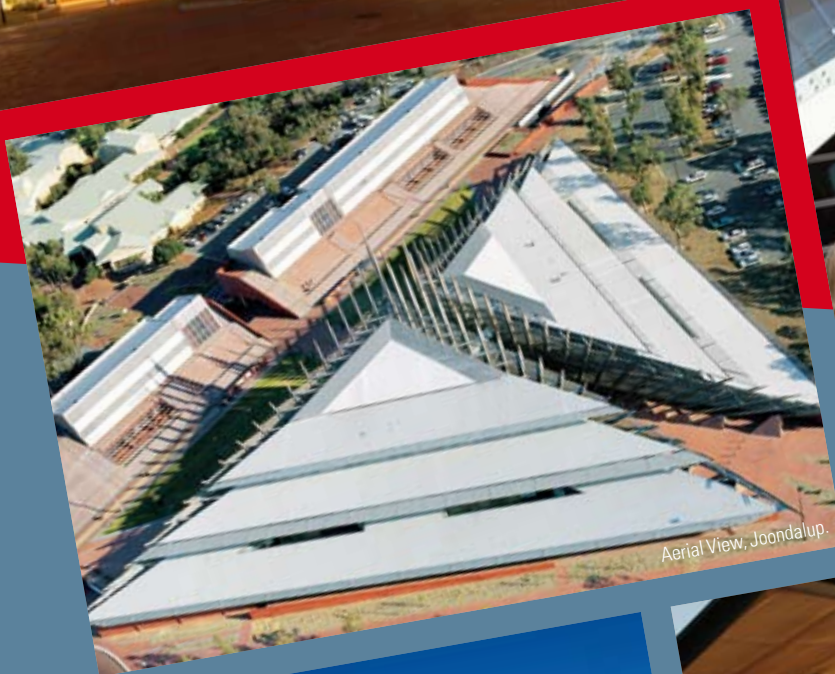

The ECU South West Campus (Bunbury) is the largest university campus outside the metropolitan area, approximately 2 hours south of Perth. The campus forms part of an educational precinct comprising South West Regional College of TAFE, Manea Senior College and the Bunbury Health Campus, which includes St John of God Hospital and South West Area Health Services. The campus has excellent facilities, small class sizes, a comprehensive range of courses and on-campus accommodation. Courses are offered in Business, Computer Technology, Creative Industries, Education, Nursing, Science, Social Work and Surf Science.



STUDY LIFE

Study Load

As an Exchange or Study Abroad student you can enrol in up to 60 credit points per semester. Most units are worth 15 credit points so a typical full-time study load is 4 units. Students who would prefer a lighter work-load may consider enrolling in 45 credit points per semester, which is still considered full-time.

Unit Choice

The Study Abroad and Exchange Office will facilitate your enrolment in your nominated units after your acceptance into the Exchange or Study Abroad program. You can search for units on ECU's online handbook <http://handbook.ecu.edu.au/> and then check whether they are offered in the required semester through the online timetable http://simo.ecu.edu.au/ecudev_calprod/viewsemtable.jsp. The timetable for the February – November academic year becomes available in late October of the preceding year. Please note that you will need to show evidence that you satisfy any prerequisites a unit has before you can be enrolled in it.

Campus Choice

As our two metropolitan campuses (Joondalup and Mount Lawley) are located approximately 25 kilometres apart it is preferable to choose units on one campus only. If you would like to enrol in units at both campuses, you should allow about 1.5 hours to travel between the two on public transport (driving takes about 30 minutes). Our South West regional campus at Bunbury, located approximately 180km south of Perth, offers a range of units if you would prefer to study in a smaller campus and town. You also have the option of studying some units online, however you will need to be enrolled in at least one on-campus unit per semester.

How do I learn?

Most students will have one lecture per week per subject, with the duration ranging from 1-3 hours. Depending on the popularity of the subject, class sizes can have anywhere from 30-350 students. Each unit usually also has a tutorial for 1-2 hours with classes of 15-30 students. Tutorials offer an excellent opportunity to further investigate and analyse key areas highlighted at the lecture.

Less contact time

University study requires a high level of motivation and responsibility. Some full-time students may spend as little as 12 hours per week in formal lectures and tutorials, depending on their unit choice. You may find your timetable is quite varied incorporating lectures, tutorials, laboratory sessions and seminars. Depending on university timetabling, you may be able to fit this into a few days or it may spread over the duration of the week. For every one hour of teaching time, you should aim to spend at least 2-3 hours to independently conduct reading, researching, preparing for exams and working on assignments.

What help can I expect?

Universities, by their very nature, are large places. It can be difficult for staff to identify if someone needs help. ECU encourages you to seek help when you need it and provides a supportive culture to facilitate this. Lecturers and tutors are more than happy to help you with any course or unit queries. In addition to financial assistance and learning support, we also offer an enormous range of support in other areas, such as counselling for academic or personal issues, career development and employment advice and medical advice. We also have Learning Advisers who can assist you with your studies.

Living Costs

Whether you live on-campus or off-campus you should budget about AUD\$400 per week. Please note that this sum does not include tuition fees, textbooks, running a car, or holiday travel.

Example Living Costs:

Rent	\$140 – \$180
Transport	\$25
Electricity and Gas	\$25
Laundry	\$10
Food and Beverages	\$120
Telephone	\$10
Medical	\$5
Other	\$65

(All prices AUD per week).

Students should also budget on AUD\$400 per semester for books and stationery, although purchasing second-hand books may save some money.

Families need to allocate a significantly larger amount per week and should consider additional expenses such as school fees and childcare costs (if applicable).

Overseas Student Health Cover

The Australian Government requires all international students studying in Australia on a student visa to pay Overseas Student Health Cover (medical insurance):

Temporary Accommodation – Short term arrangement while finalising permanent accommodation.

On-Campus Accommodation – Self catering units on Joondalup, Mount Lawley and the South West (Bunbury) campuses.

Rental Accommodation – Renting an apartment, villa or house off-campus, individually or with other students.

Homestay – Living with an Australian family in their private home.

Temporary Accommodation

ECU organises temporary accommodation for all international students arriving in Perth for the first time.

Our temporary accommodation venues are good value (\$35 – \$45 per night), clean, modern and conveniently located. Temporary accommodation arrangements will be made only once the University has received your completed Airport Reception form. Please go to www.ecu.edu.au/student/orientation to book temporary accommodation and airport reception.

On-Campus Accommodation

On-campus accommodation is provided in self-catered apartments on all campuses. The student villages cater for a total of 366 students and provide a modern, friendly environment with the majority of apartments supporting a six-bedroom configuration with shared kitchen, living facilities and 1-2 bathrooms. Additional to the convenience of living on-campus, all villages are located within close proximity to local shops, sport and recreation facilities and are easily accessible by public transport.

The villages are operated by leading student accommodation provider, Campus Living Villages, in partnership with ECU. You'll be supported by a great team of Residential Assistants and will enjoy a full student life program, designed to help you make friends and make the most of your on-campus experience.

Rental Accommodation

Apartment / House / Townhouse

Some students choose to share an apartment, house, unit, or townhouse on their own or with fellow students. In general, houses are more expensive than apartments and the rent varies depending on the size, condition, and location.

Private accommodation is either rented furnished or unfurnished.

A general guide to rentals in Perth per week is listed below; (All prices AUD):

Unfurnished 1 bedroom from	\$100 – \$160
Furnished 1 bedroom from	\$140 – \$200
Unfurnished 2 bedroom from	\$200 – \$280
Furnished 2 bedroom from	\$240 – \$300
Unfurnished 3 bedroom from	\$300 – \$430
Unfurnished 4 bedroom from	\$360 – \$490

Note: With private rentals the tenant is usually responsible for utilities (Gas/Electricity/Water).

Room Only

This type of accommodation involves renting a private bedroom but with access to the facilities of the house / property and is popular for students as the most cost effective method of accommodation for the period of their study.

Prices can range from \$100 – \$160 per week. Usually these arrangements do not require formal tenancy agreements and can be negotiable to the shorter periods required to match the academic year.

Homestay

Students can also choose to live in a private home with an Australian family. The chance to be involved in the daily life, the learning of our culture and customs plus the added advantage of having the company of other people are just some of the reasons Homestay is popular. The prices for Homestay are currently:

Room Only (Very limited availability)

\$150 per week

No meals provided: student has full use of household facilities including kitchen

Room & Breakfast

\$170 per week

Breakfast only provided: student has full use of household facilities including kitchen

Half board

\$220 per week

Breakfast and dinner during the week, and lunch also on the weekends

Full board

\$240 per week

Breakfast, lunch, and dinner provided every day

These prices may vary depending on individual arrangements. Students can request a homestay placement before leaving their city of residence and will be notified of the family details so they can go straight there from the airport. Off-Campus Housing Office (OCHO)

Managed by Campus Living Villages, the OCHO offers a free Off-Campus Housing Service to all students and staff of the University. The OCHO assists you in your search for accommodation, providing maps, bus routes, and information on leases or contracts.

International students are offered further assistance, whereby groups of students are shown a maximum of three properties when they first arrive. This service is offered once only to new students and is only available during peak periods, which are 4 weeks prior to the start of semesters.

Arrival Reception and Temporary Accommodation

ECU is proud to offer this service to all new students arriving in Perth to study at ECU. You will be met at the airport, at a pre arranged time, and transported to your accommodation, which can be booked on your behalf. Use our simple and convenient online booking system to ensure a smooth arrival in Perth. This service is for ECU enrolled students only and does not apply to those students studying English or other courses prior to ECU entry. Learning Advisers

Learning Advisers from the ECU Learning Centres on each campus can assist you with a range of study skills and advice in preparing your assignments. The advisers conduct workshops, provide guest lectures, teach courses, prepare academic skill resources, support other academic staff in promotion of tertiary literacy skills and see students one-on-one and in-group consultations. Off-campus students can email, fax or phone for assistance.

Orientation Week

Orientation starts prior to the commencement of classes during semester one and two and incorporates a range of activities designed to equip new students with the skills and confidence to adjust to uni life and all you need to know about living in Perth. It's a perfect opportunity for new students to get acquainted with their course, their teaching staff and the university support services as well as to meet new people and have some fun!

Pre-Departure Information

ECU offers comprehensive pre-departure information, providing advice on everything you need to know to ensure a safe and easy arrival in Australia and a smooth move into your new life as an ECU student.

Schooling of Dependants of ECU Students

If bringing dependant children you will need to consider specific arrangements for their visas and schooling. In Australia it is compulsory for school aged children (aged 6 – 17) to attend school.

Dependants of Undergraduate and Graduate Diploma students are able to enrol in either government or private schools on a fee-paying basis, which must be paid directly to the school prior to enrolment.

The Western Australian State Government provides free State schooling to dependants of Masters and PhD students subject to available places. However, a placement fee applies and you will be liable to pay a minimal fee to the school to cover the costs of books and class excursions. This can range from \$100 – \$300.

Students should note that the cost for any special requirements such as Special Education and English as a Second Language support for your children will be an additional charge over and above the prescribed fee. This can be as high as \$8,000 per year.

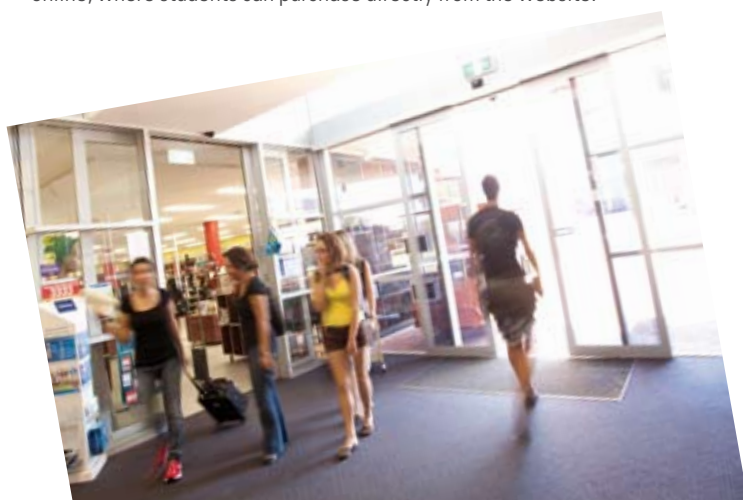
ON-CAMPUS FACILITIES
