



University Wide Leadership Program in Japan

1-15 July 2018

Participate in this Tokyo study tour and give yourself a competitive edge in the global employment market.

Currently enrolled ECU students can apply to participate in a two-week intensive study tour that will focus on leadership and soft skills development. In the first week, students will engage with Japanese history and culture, both in the classroom and through a series of trips to iconic cultural places of significance. A daily program, providing conversational Japanese and leadership workshops will be included to ensure an immersive experience. In the second week, students will gain industry exposure, which will focus on preparing students for transition into the workplace. This study tour will take place in collaboration with Tokyo City University and local companies, offering an opportunity to gain an international experience.

This study tour is targeted at ECU students who have demonstrated leadership and have actively contributed to campus life at ECU, especially through the Tokyo City University (TCU) Buddy Program.

Students will be required to enroll in the study tour unit (SAH2100 Cross-Cultural Knowledge and Global Citizenship) and this must be able to attract credit towards their degree.

The program will cost around \$4,500 and the Australian Government, through the New Colombo Plan Mobility Program, is supporting this tour, with 12 eligible students receiving up to \$3,000 to assist with program costs.

Applications close on Friday, 16 March 2018.
