Bachelor of Aviation G96 & Bachelor of Science (Aviation) G04

Satisfactory performance in a TEE mathematics unit or equivalent.

Bachelor of Communications (Screen Studies) M35

Admission to this major will be by interview and showreel/portfolio presentation.

Bachelor of Computer Science U65

Students wishing to complete a Games Programming major must complete a TEE mathematics subject or equivalent.

Bachelor of Contemporary Arts G79

Students will be required to have a portfolio interview or audition.

Bachelor of Creative Industries G80

A portfolio interview or audition for the Graphic Design and Interior and Spatial Design programs.

Bachelor of Education (Primary) K15 & Bachelor of Education (Primary to Middle Years) K29

Students are required to have a criminal track clearance prior to entering schools on professional practice, www.education.ecu.edu.au/prac/
In addition students will be required to meet requirements of the Working with Children (Criminal Record Checking) Act 2004 www.checkwwc.wa.gov.au/Employees/default.htm

Bachelor of Engineering (Computer Systems) E66 & Bachelor of Engineering (Instrumentation Control and Automation) G93

Satisfactory performance in TEE (or equivalent) Calculus or Applicable Mathematics is required.

Bachelor of Hospitality Management E04

TEE mathematics subject or the equivalent.

Bachelor of Science (Applied Mathematics & Statistics) K01

Completion of TEE Applicable Mathematics or TEE Calculus at Year 12 level.

Bachelor of Science (Nursing) – three year program K45

Applicants who are **registered mental health nurses** will be considered for direct admission into the Bachelor of Science (Nursing) course and are eligible for advanced standing.

Applicants in possession of **enrolled nurse** status will be considered for direct admission into the Bachelor of Science (Nursing) course and are eligible for advanced standing. Details are available from the School of Nursing, Midwifery and Postgraduate Medicine.

Applicants are required to have computer word processing skills.

To be able to undertake clinical practice and fulfil their duty of care, students are required to complete risk management protocols on commencement of the course and carry out amendments in subsequent semesters as appropriate. Risk management protocols include, but are not restricted to:

- Statement of Federal Police Clearance;
- Current Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) – initial certification required plus annual renewal of certification – courses available via ECU provider;
- Current Manual Handling Certification – initial certification required plus annual renewal of certification – courses available via ECU provider;
- Evidence of immunisation status as per the Department of Health schedule www.health.wa.gov.au/circulars/pdfs/11859.pdf
- MRSA clearance if worked in, or been admitted to, a health facility outside of Western Australia in the 12 months prior to enrolment;
- Working with Children Check www.checkwwc.wa.gov.au

Bachelor of Science (Nursing) – one year conversion course K46

Applicants must be currently registered nurses and show evidence of recent practice with minimum two years clinical experience.

Bachelor of Science (Occupational Therapy) H96

To fulfil duty of care responsibilities, a Risk Management form is to be completed on enrolment and amended in subsequent semesters as appropriate. Part of the risk management includes:

- Statement of Federal Police Clearance on enrolment;
- Current Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) certification within one month after the start of first semester;
- Evidence of immunisation schedule as per the Health Department of WA; plus
- MRSA clearance if hospitalised or worked outside of WA in 12 months prior to enrolment.

Bachelor of Science (Psychology) E37

Satisfactory performance in a TEE Science subject is expected.

Bachelor of Science 308

A pass in one TEE Science subject or one TEE Mathematics subject or equivalent. Equivalent studies include bridging units in Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry.
