



2026 SSCI Planetary Health Study Tour in Fiji

This program, hosted by Fiji National University (FNU), is for ECU students interested in the intersection of environmental and public health. Students will gain firsthand experience of planetary health issues important to the Pacific and understand the political and cultural frameworks governing Fiji's society.

They will attend seminars and field demonstrations with project partners including FNU, WISH Fiji, the World Health Organisation (WHO), and various NGOs. Students will visit traditional villages to speak with communities experiencing environmental change and work with Fijian organisations to implement and evaluate nature-based public health solutions.

Students will gain 15 credit points through ISS3101.

This project is supported by the Australian Government's New Colombo Plan (NCP). To be eligible, you must be an Australian citizen and enrolled in an undergraduate course. There are 10 places available and students will receive \$4,000 to assist with program costs.
