Robert French AC Chancellor

Chancellor University of Western Australia

Robert French was appointed Chief Justice of the High Court of Australia in September 2008 and he retired from office in January 2017. He was appointed a Judge of the Federal Court of Australia in November 1986, an office he held until his appointment as Chief Justice in September 2008.

From 1994 to 1998 he was the President of the National Native Title Tribunal. He was elected as Chancellor of the University of Western Australia in December 2017.

Mr French was the inaugural Chancellor of ECU, serving for six years from 1 January 1991 to 31 December 1996.

Jessica Shaw is the Member for Swan Hills in the WA Legislative Assembly and Parliamentary Secretary for Tourism, Culture and the Arts and Heritage.
