

## EDL1240 PLANNING DOCUMENTS – SEMESTER 1, 2026

Pre-service Teachers are required to have a dedicated Professional Experience File which they will take to the school on each Distributed Day.

- It should be available at all times for reviewing by Mentor Teachers and School Practice Coordinators.
- Professional Experience files should demonstrate a high level of organisation and a high standard of presentation of all documents.
- Documents should be word processed, where possible, or written neatly and legibly.

### PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE FILE

The Professional Experience file for this First Year Professional Experience should contain:

An informative cover page, including such details as:

- Pre-service Teacher's name
- Course Title e.g. *Bachelor of Education (Primary)*
- Unit Code *EDL1240*
- Dates of Professional Experience
- Name of school
- Principal
- School Practice Coordinator
- Mentor Teacher(s) and corresponding year level (if applicable)

**For ALL students (regardless of whether you are 18 or not):**

- Mandatory Reporter Training completion certificate

**For students 18 years and above:**

- *Nationally Coordinated Criminal History Check* (issued by the WA Department of Education)
- A copy of their *Working with Children Check* card

Weekly observations from the designated topics for reflective journal entries (see below)

The Learning Experience Plan (LEP) for the lesson to be conducted on day 6.

Pre-service Teachers may also choose to include useful information about the school (e.g. policies) and about the classroom (timetable, routines etc.).

### Professional Observation Guide

Pre-service Teachers are required to conduct weekly observations of and reflections on their school-based experiences. The specified topics are intended to give purpose to Pre-service Teachers' observations and to provide a starting point for professional dialogue. This in turn, provides a focus for journal writing which will become part of the assessment of the EDL1240 unit. The topics listed in the Professional Observation Guide may be varied for discussion purposes to take advantage of timely moments when topics arise spontaneously.

These tasks remain the responsibility of the Pre-service Teacher and it is not intended that Mentor Teachers provide assistance with the journal writing process, other than engaging in discussions about the topics with Pre-service Teachers.
