

Waste and Recycling at ECU Waste Streams at ECU

There are many diverse types of waste produced at ECU. Some of these include:

- 1. Paper and Cardboard: magazines, newspapers, office paper.
- 2. **Containers for Change:** most aluminium, glass, plastic, steel, and liquid paperboard drink containers that are 150ml to 3l <u>with the "10c"</u> mark.
- Recyclables: paper, cardboard, newspapers, aluminium cans, clean plastic bottles, tubs and containers, steel cans, glass bottles and jars <u>without the "10c"</u> mark.
- 4. **General waste**: food scraps, used food containers, takeaway coffee cups, serviettes, plastic bags, ceramics, cling wraps, freezer bags.
- 5. **Compost waste:** fruit and vegetable scraps, grains, coffee grounds, dairy, eggs, meat, bones, leftover food.
- 6. Aerosol Cans: keyboard cleaners, insect spray.
- 7. E-waste (electronic waste): computers, printers, keyboards, cables.
- 8. Green waste: tree pruning's and garden waste.
- 9. Nespresso Capsules: coffee pods.
- 10. Construction and demolition waste: plaster, steel, concrete.
- 11. Other hazardous waste: Medical waste from laboratories
- 12. Freecycling

We can recycle many of these waste streams on campus. Bins are available and are clearly marked to demonstrate what goes in each bin:



General Waste

General waste can be disposed of within your office using mini bins. These are the small bins that supports the ethos, less is better. The mini bin is simply not big enough to hold all your general and recyclable waste, making the individual think about where these items need to be disposed of. It is the responsibility of all staff to empty and clean their mini bins. If mini bins are not being cleaned regularly by staff, they may be removed.

General waste such as disposable coffee cups and their lids, food scraps, dirty takeaway food containers, serviettes, plastic bags and ceramics.

<u>Recycling</u>

Recycling bins are available in all buildings at the Joondalup, Mt Lawley and South West campuses including in kitchens and cafes.

The waste collection contractor collects these bins on a regular basis and takes them to the waste compound facility for processing and sorting.

The following items CANNOT be recycled:

- Take away coffee cups.
- Any item or container that has food scraps in it or contains any liquid inside of it.
- Plastic shopping bags.
- Ceramics.
- Paper towels and serviettes.
- Broken bottles/drink glasses; and
- Shrink wrap/freezer bags.

Waste Stations

Indoor Waste stations

In all campuses, waste stations have been introduced in the following locations:

- Office areas/corridors.
- Lecture theatres and laboratories.
- Kitchens; and
- Cafes

Staff are encouraged to 'hand in' their mini bins and use the waste stations instead. This will promote regular breaks from computer screens and allows staff to get up and stretch their legs regularly.

Outdoor Waste Stations

Waste stations are installed at all campuses.



Paper and Cardboard Recycling

Paper - each individual should have a desk paper recycling box located underneath their desk or share one with a colleague. It is the responsibility of each office occupant to empty these desk side paper boxes into the larger 120L light blue SULO bins. These boxes accept a range of mixed paper and small cardboard; please see below for more detail.

Confidential Papers: Shredding is a common way to destroy confidential paper documents, however ECU do provide confidential bins for disposal of sensitive documents.

Cardboard - All cardboard boxes can be recycled by breaking them down and placing them beside the 120L blue SULO paper recycling bin. Cleaners will pick these up only if they are flattened. Please remove as much packing tape or other plastic materials and place these items in general rubbish bins. Please do not put cardboard boxes into the paper recycling bins.

Recyclable Hazardous Waste

Batteries and Mobile Phones

ECU staff and students can recycle batteries (except car batteries) at all campuses.

More than 90% of materials in mobile phones, batteries and accessories can be recovered and used to make new products.

Fluorescent Tubes/Globes

Fluorescent tubes and globes are used in ECU lighting (interior and exterior) and are replaced by the Maintenance Contractor when they are no longer working.

Fluorescent tubes contain a small amount of mercury which is extremely toxic, so be sure to handle any globes with care to ensure they do not break.

E-Waste (electronic Waste)

This waste refers to discarded appliances or equipment such as computers, monitors, keyboards, mouse, fax machines, cables, and telephones and these items may contain hazardous substances. Once they are deemed no longer useable, they need to be disposed of correctly.

E-waste can be recycled using the e-waste bins around campus.

If electronic items are in still good working order, you can Freecycle them.

<u>Aerosol Cans</u>

For disposal of aerosol cans staff are to raise a job with the Facilities Service Desk i.e., email <u>maint@ecu.edu.au</u> or telephone 6304 5554 to arrange collection.

The ECU cleaning contractor (currently ISS) will store the aerosol cans in special bins located in the ECU waste compound as "hazardous waste". Once enough cans are collected or when scheduled hazardous waste collections are due from the ECU waste compound, Cleanaway will dispose of them.

Green Waste

Green Waste (grass cuttings and compostable organics) is managed by Grounds Services.

Tree Pruning by External Contractor - Most tree pruning is undertaken by a contractor at both metropolitan campuses. The contractor mulches tree pruning's on-site and uses it in ECU gardens.

General Green waste from campus operations - This includes leaves, branches and other plant material, and stockpile at each campus until there is enough to be both mulched and reused on campus grounds or an external contractor will remove from site and take to a waste recycling facility.

Construction and Demolition Waste

This waste includes items such as: plaster board; bricks; steel; cables; and packaging. The Projects and Planning Team manage this waste.

Freecycling

If you have items that are in good working order that others might like to use, you can deposit these at the Freecycling stations found in the library of each metropolitan campus. Please do not dispose of general waste, items that may be dangerous, or do not work at the Freecycling station.
