Student Safety Initiatives at ECU

The results from the first national survey on university student experiences of sexual assault and sexual harassment were released in 2017. Since then, ECU has...

- [1] Responded to the findings of the <u>Change the Course: National</u> <u>Report on Sexual Assault and Sexual Harassment at Australian</u> <u>Universities</u> and <u>implemented</u> all 9 recommendations.
- [2] Introduced a new, comprehensive <u>Sexual Assault and Sexual</u> <u>Harassment (SASH) Policy.</u>
- [3] Set up an <u>online reporting tool</u>, where students and staff can report sexual assault and sexual harassment. Students and staff can also report anonymously.
- [4] Expanded our <u>University Contact Officer program.</u>
- [5] Made it easier to report by streamlining our website, including reporting sections for both staff and students.
- [6] Recognised that students will often disclose to their peers first, so we've <u>created resources</u> to support them.
- [7] Rolled out the online training program, <u>Consent Matters</u>, for ECU students.
- [8] Updated our Orientation material to include reporting tools, pathways to support and training for our new students.
- [9] Included the <u>Sexual Harassment/Assault: Reducing & Responding</u> module in our staff training schedule.
- [10] Run both the <u>Respect. Now. Always.</u> and <u>Be a Better Human</u> awareness campaigns across our campuses.
