About the Advisory Board

The Advisory Board of the Western Australian Academy of Performing Arts (WAAPA Advisory Board) provides the University Council with strategic advice in relation to WAAPA. The Advisory Board comprises:

- up to six external members appointed by Council;
- two *ex-officio* members (Vice-Chancellor or nominee, and the Executive Dean, WAAPA); and
- two internal members appointed by Council (a student member and a staff member).

The Advisory Board usually meets up to four times per year, on a Tuesday afternoon at ECU City.

Role of the Student Member

The Student Member provides a valuable student perspective on matters considered by the Advisory Board. Membership also offers an excellent opportunity to build networks with influential members of the community.

Qualifications

The Student Member of the Advisory Board must be a currently enrolled student of WAAPA. (If employed other than casually, the Student Member's principal employment must not be that of a member of staff of the University.)

If the Student Member of the Advisory Board ceases to be an enrolled student of WAAPA during the term of their Advisory Board membership, they will no longer be eligible to serve as a member.

Term of Office

The term of office of the Student Member for 2027 will be from 1 January 2027 to 31 December 2027.

2. TEQSA's – *Fit and Proper Person Requirements Declaration* (**Note:** A nominee who is unable to complete a *Fit and Proper Person Declaration* to the Vice-Chancellor's satisfaction is ineligible for appointment to the Advisory Board).

- Thursday 10 December: University Council will appoint the Student Member of the Advisory Board for 2027
- Monday 14 December: all students who submitted an Expression of Interest will be advised of outcome
