Julia is currently a PhD candidate, her work aims to blur the boundaries between design, visual art, and cultural studies. Her background is in painting, graphic design and art education. Julia is a published author and illustrator, her first editorial volume *Tracing behind the image: An interdisciplinary exploration of visual literacy* published in October 2020.

Artist Statement

The feminine has long been demonised, via cultural narratives and depictions which work to oppress and 'other'. Julia's visual research aims to subvert this rhetoric and challenge the use of the monster as an icon of evil in this past, simplistic dichotomy. Her work aims to playfully question whether monstrosity can be reframed as strength, beauty, and agency within the contemporary visual economy of our increasingly imagistic world.
