Your OSHC Membership Card

Following this your membership card will be posted to your Australian address. You should receive it within 10 days. Alternatively, you can access the Digital card on the App straightway.

Your card verifies that you have health cover if you need to go to hospital or see a doctor (GP).







What to do if you fall sick?



What to do if you are feeling unwell?



A GP will normally be the **first** doctor you visit when you are unwell. GPs treat minor medical issues such as stomach aches, fevers, diarrhoea and prescribe medications. A GP is located at a Medical Clinic.



24/7 Student Health and Support Line on 1800 887 283 gives you access to a registered nurse or counselling.



In a medical **emergency**, you should call **000** for an ambulance.



How do I find a doctor?

Medibank has special arrangements with some oncampus and close to campus GP medical clinics that use our direct billing system.

Visit the Medibank OSHC App or the medibank.com.au/oshc and select 'Find a provider' to find your nearest partner doctor.





Where do I buy Medicines?



After your visit to a GP, you might be prescribed some medication. You can take your prescription to a pharmacy, such as Chemist Warehouse, Priceline Pharmacy or Amcal.

Make sure to collect a tax receipt, to claim back the cost. (Minus \$30, paid by you)



Emergencies



What to do in an emergency?



- Call 000 and ask for an ambulance if you, or someone nearby, are seriously injured or in need of urgent medical attention.
- If you're not sure whether you or someone nearby is experiencing something that could be life-threatening, it is always best to call triple zero (000). You will be asked which service you require, and you can tell the operator that you need an ambulance.
- If you're not confident speaking in English, you can ask the operator for an interpreter. Just be aware this might add extra time.

What does my Medibank OSHC cover?



Your Medibank OSHC includes benefits toward hospital and medical costs while you are studying in Australia. This includes:

Visits to General Practitioners (GPs) and specialists

Treatment by doctors in hospitals, such as surgeons and anaesthetists

Pathology tests

X-rays

Hospital accommodation costs

Prescription medicines

Emergency ambulance transport



Your OSHC also includes access to health advice from a registered nurse 24 hours a day at **1800 887 283**

Please notes if you are admitted to hospital waiting periods may apply including 12 months for pre-existing conditions.

Feeling Sad or Anxious?





Medibank Better Health Index recently found that in people over 18 years old, incidence of stress amongst those who are not studying is 24.3%; while incidence of stress amongst those who are studying is 31.2%.

It is completely normal to feel sad, homesick, depressed or anxious as an international student. All students experience stress.



Ask for help



Remember that it's okay to ask for help, there's nothing to be ashamed of.



Make an appointment at your universities medical centre if there is one, ask student services if there's a counsellor you can see, or visit a doctor and ask what you should do.

Public vs Private Healthcare System

The Public Healthcare System (Medicare)

Medicare is operated through the Australian government and gives Australian residents, and some international visitors, free or discounted health services through the public healthcare system. If you're from a country with a Reciprocal Health Care Agreement (RHCA) you might receive some Medicare benefits, also known as Reciprocal Medicare.

Private Healthcare System

The private healthcare system (which Medibank is part of) complements the public healthcare system, or if you're not eligible for Medicare, it replaces it. Medibank provides private health insurance (also known as overseas health cover) to overseas students, visitors and workers to help with the cost of medical services provided in the private and public healthcare system. This includes doctor (GP) visits, hospital treatments and emergency ambulance trips.

How overseas cover helps with hospital visits?

Cost of Medical Treatment

If you need medical attention while you're in Australia and you don't have health cover it can be very expensive, whether you're treated in the public or the private healthcare system.

Hospital visits

When you're treated in hospital by a doctor, surgeon or anaesthetist the set fee is called the Medicare Benefits Schedule (MBS) fee. If the person treating you charges only the MBS fee (and the service is included in your policy) you will be covered by Medibank for the service. If they choose to charge above the MBS fee, then you will have to pay the difference. This is referred to as an out-of-pocket cost because it literally comes out of your own pocket. Medibank has agreements with most private hospitals and day surgeries in Australia and we call this our Members' Choice network. When you visit a Members' Choice hospital you will generally get better value for money compared to a non-Members' Choice private hospital (as long as the service you receive is covered by our agreement with the hospital and is included in your cover).

Doctor (GP and specialist) visits

For Overseas Student Health Covers we pay 100% of the MBS fee for GP's visits and 85% of the MBS fee for specialists. This means if your GP doesn't charge above the MBS fee, you won't need to pay anything. If they choose to charge above the MBS fee you'll have to pay towards the service (an out-of-pocket cost).

For example: The MBS fee for item 23 (a GP visit) is \$38.20. You visit a doctor that charges \$50. Your overseas health cover pays only 100% of the MBS fee. So you would pay \$50, get back \$38.20 and have an out-of-pocket cost of \$11.80.

Cost of Medication

In-hospital

The benefits we pay towards medication provided as part of your hospital treatment depends on your cover, so it's a good idea to call us before your treatment to understand the benefits you should receive. It's important to note that if high cost medicine is required for your treatment (such as some antibiotic or cancer medicines) you might have to pay a significant amount of your own money.

Out-of-hospital

Our Overseas Student Health Covers and include benefits for pharmaceuticals. This means they can also help with the cost of prescription-only medication prescribed by a doctor (GP and specialist) outside of hospital. Benefits will only be paid after a set charge has been deducted and we don't pay benefits towards most oral contraceptives or medicines prescribed for cosmetic purposes.
