The seven pillars honour the Nyoongar story of the "Seven Sisters" constellation and are placed accordingly. Facing north, the pillars indicate the location of the constellation, and as you leave Kurongkurl Katitjin, you see the names of past Indigenous graduates who have led the way, inspiring others to follow in their footsteps.
