

Introduction

This Residential Handbook is for Social Work students studying in the online mode. It explains the purposes, scope and scheduling of the residential component of your studies and includes detailed information about transport, accommodation and the ECU South West and Mount Lawley campuses. As you may gather, forward planning for your residential blocks is essential and this handbook will assist you with this task.

Disclaimer: Details about the residential and other information contained herein are subject to change. It is the responsibility of each student to confirm the details in this handbook, especially as it pertains to third party services, such as transport and accommodation.

What are residentials?

Residentials blocks are set periods of on-campus contact where you receive support, tuition and study opportunities on-campus. Residentials enable students to integrate skills development, gain learning support, participate in social events, make contact with social workers and agencies and complete parts of their studies in a face-to-face on-campus learning environment.

Most of the residential blocks for the social work course are provided at the ECU South West campus or the Mount Lawley campus.

The Australian Association of Social Workers (AASW) is the national accrediting body for all social work courses in Australia. The AASW makes provisions for social work courses to be delivered in mixed mode, or off-campus delivery modes. A condition of this arrangement is that students attend regular on-campus activities. Social Work at ECU supports this principle and considers on-campus attendance in residential format good practice regarding students learning about social work, but also regarding building stronger ties and connections between staff, students and ECU.

Students who elect to study online will be required to attend campus for face-to-face, classroom-based activities for a minimum of 20 days (140 hours) spread over the four years of the course. This is a requirement set by the Australian Association of Social Workers (AASW) for accredited programs that are offered online. Graduates of accredited programs are eligible for membership to AASW.

Who do you contact for further residential information?

Student Hub is your student information centre and the place to go with any enrolment related queries including the residential component of your Social Work course. Simply email your query to enquiries@ecu.edu.au or call on 134 328 and ask to speak to the Student Hub Team on the South West campus. Student Hub South West is located in Building 1 on the South West Campus.

Attendance requirements

Attendance at the 2nd, 3rd and 4th year program residentials is **mandatory** for online students and is a necessary condition for completing the Bachelor of Social Work in the online study mode. <u>This is an AASW Accreditation Requirement</u>.

Attendance expectations are as follows:

Students are typically enrolled in either 2nd, 3rd, or 4th year level units and will only need to attend a residential when they are enrolled in designated residential block units. These designated residential units are as follows:

Second Year

Students enrolled in SWK2111 Aboriginal Histories of the Present OFF-Campus must attend the residential block component for this unit in first semester on the Mount Lawley campus in Perth, in order to pass this unit.

Third Year

- Students enrolled in SWK3112 Social Work Theory and Practice 1 OFF-Campus must attend
 the residential block component of this unit on the South West (Bunbury) campus in first
 semester, in order to pass this unit.
- Students enrolled in SWK3121 Social Work Theory and Practice 2 must attend the 3rd year residential block unit in Term 4 on the Mt Lawley campus, in order to pass this unit.

Fourth Year

- Students enrolled in SWK4111 Social Work Theory and Practice 3 OFF-Campus must attend
 the residential block component of this unit in first semester on the South West (Bunbury)
 Campus, in order to pass this unit.
- Students enrolled in SWK4121 Social Work Theory and Practice 4 must attend the 4th year residential block unit in Term 4 on the South West (Bunbury) or Mt Lawley Campus, in order to pass this unit.

If you foresee ongoing difficulties in attending the residentials and meeting the mandatory requirements set by the AASW, you may need to consider if studying the Bachelor of Social Work in online mode is suitable for you.

Important dates

Residential Dates for Semester 1, 2024

Residential Block	Dates	Involves
2 nd Year Unit Residential	Group A: 26 th February – 1 st March (Week 2 of Semester) Group B: 5 th – 8 th March (Week 3 of Semester)	Students enrolled in SWK2111 Aboriginal Histories of the Present OFF-Campus. This residential is held in at the ECU Mount Lawley campus and is provided by Kurongkurl Katitjin staff. Students will be able to select a residential group when they enrol in the unit. Group B will only run if enrolment numbers support two groups.
3 rd Year Unit Residential	11 th – 15 th March (Week 4 of Semester)	Students enrolled in <i>SWK3112 Social Work Theory</i> and Practice 1 OFF-Campus. This residential is held at the ECU South West (Bunbury) campus.
4 th Year Unit Residential	15 th – 19 th April (Week 8 of Semester)	Students enrolled in SWK4111 Social Work Theory and Practice 3 OFF-Campus. This residential is held at the ECU South West (Bunbury) campus.

Residential Dates for Term 4, 2024

Residential Block	Dates	Involves
3 rd Year Unit Residential	21 st Oct– 25 th Oct (Week 13)	Students enrolled in <i>SWK3121 Social Work Theory</i> and Practice 2. This residential is held at the ECU Mt Lawley Campus.
4 th Year Unit Residential	28 th Oct– 1st Nov (Study Week)	Students enrolled in <i>SWK4121 Social Work Theory</i> and Practice 4. This residential is held at the ECU South West (Bunbury) and Mt Lawley Campus.

Please note that the campus location for residential blocks is subject to change on an annual basis, but their location is confirmed in November of the year prior for planning purposes.

SWK2108 Addictions and Practice	17 th June – 25 th June	Students enrolled in this Winter Unit will need to complete 7 x 6 hour seminars on campus at ECU South West (Bunbury) campus

Public transport in Bunbury

Simply look for the 'Bunbury Health Campus' or 'South West College' stops as these are located either side of the EDU South West (Bunbury) Campus.

Travelling to Bunbury by road from Perth




Figure 1: Location of ECU South West Campus and key travel points

Bunbury is approximately 180kms south of Perth. Depending on Perth traffic, car travel from Perth to Bunbury takes approximately 2 hours via the south-bound Kwinana Freeway / Forrest Highway. As you head into Bunbury via the Australind Bypass, turn left into Robertson Drive. The ECU South West campus is on Robertson Drive and the location of the campus and key travel points are outlined in Figure 1.

Accommodation

The responsibility for arranging accommodation rests with the student. This section explains the accommodation options available to students. Some students may not need these options as they may reside in the location where the residential or block unit is happening and therefore can travel to and from the campus each day. This information is for those students who live outside the area in which the residential or block unit is being held and therefore need accommodation options.

Low-cost accommodation

Nearby childcare centres

The South West and Mt Lawley campuses have <u>creche</u> facilities which offer *short-term* care for children 2 months to 5 years of age – costs are around \$5 per child per hour within a minimum booking time of 1 hour.

Location of Mt Lawley Campus in Perth




Figure 2: Location of ECU Mt Lawley Campus
