Associate Professor Hadrian Djajadikerta Associate Dean Research School of Business and Law Studies have suggested that within the information security chain, insiders remain as one of the weakest links in the effort to secure organisational information system assets. Insiders are members of an organisation who sit behind the organisational firewall and are empowered with certain levels of user privileges. They have a dual role in information security systems, both as allies and as a source of threats. Despite rapid advancement in protection technologies as well as information system security policies and procedures, security breaches remain significant, and some are substantially linked to the actions of insiders. Are all insiders' dysfunctional accounting information system behaviours created the same? Are there any differences in intentions underlying dysfunctional accounting information system behaviours? What antecedents that influence the dysfunctional behaviour intentions?

Hadrian Djajadikerta is Associate Dean Research and Associate Professor of Strategic Management Accounting at SBL. An industrial engineer, chartered accountant, management accountant and project manager by training, Hadrian had a decade experience as a management consultant, a project manager, and a corporate trainer for large enterprises and governmental departments, prior to joining academia. He has now over two decades of leadership, research and teaching, and has previously held academic positions at the University of New South Wales, Lincoln University, and University of Technology Sydney. Hadrian is also the Founding Member and Vice President of Indonesia Institute Inc., in Perth.
