Edith Cowan is an Australian icon

ECU is the only Australian university named after a woman – and what a woman she was!

Edith Cowan (OBE) achieved so much in her life, and in a world that didn't pay attention to the opinions of women.

The first woman elected to an Australian Parliament, Edith believed that education was fundamental to tackling social issues and was the key to growth, change and improvement.

She influenced the course of education in Australia, paving the way for many people to access education they could only previously dream of.

Like our university, Edith also believed strongly in the values of inclusion and equity. She fought hard to improve conditions for women, children, families, the poor, the under-educated and the elderly.



Tailored Study Abroad at ECU

ECU has extensive experience building Tailored Study Abroad Programs to enable its partners to meet specific cohort needs.

In the next couple of years, well over 2,000 international students will have completed one of our tailored programs. We are ambitious in this space and we do it well.

Our core 13-week program model includes English, academic, social and cultural components. Whilst we tailor the program in consultation with you, our expertise ranges from 15 students in a program, to over 100. As such, we have developed each component to provide the necessary English support, and academic rigour, which we understand is important to our partners and students alike.

In 2024, we will also continue to offer the postgraduate research program in ECU's Tailored Study Abroad Program, to complement our undergraduate offering.

The all-inclusive fee per student for our Tailored Study Abroad Program is A\$9,000.

Whilst this is for a minimum cohort of 15, we look to be guided by our partners for their maximum cohort number.

This comprehensive price includes:

- Formal pre-departure and orientation sessions (with home-language support where possible)
- Airport transfers (pick-up and drop-off)
- Welcome and farewell lunch or dinner
- · Welcome and farewell VIP ceremonies
- 5 weeks of English language studies
- 7 weeks of academic studies (undergraduate or postgraduate)
- Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC)
- ECU's Experiencing Australia Program, a social and cultural component including:
 - A Buddy Ambassador program, partnering participants with ECU student volunteers
 - 3 on-campus activities, such as quiz and movie nights
 - 3 off-campus excursions to iconic Perth locations
 - Weekly student integration initiatives, offered via the Student Guild
- Participation certificate and official ECU transcript



English studies with Edith Cowan College



The 2024 Tailored Study Abroad Program starts with a 5-week English component, which is generally delivered in partnership with our pathway partner, Edith Cowan College (ECC). ECC is renowned for its excellent teaching staff, high-quality learning, and outstanding facilities. These classes provide an intensive but fun preparation for each student's academic modules, which start from week seven of the program.

Conveniently located on the ECU Mount Lawley Campus, students will undertake studies in Improving English: Speaking and Listening, which develops their listening, comprehension and English language speaking skills. Based on the 'Common European Framework of Reference for Languages: Learning, Teaching and Assessment' the unit focuses on a key set of English language competencies that will enable students to engage in academic activity in an English language environment.

Academic modules

The 7-week academic component of ECU's 2024 Tailored Study Abroad Program is designed to provide a global context for students to apply to their overall degree studies. The available units are outlined below, and can be built into the core undergraduate or postgraduate research program, in collaboration with our partner.

Undergraduate Program Units

Creativity and Design

This unit offers students an introduction to a range of issues in the Creativity and Design space, which have Australian and global relevance. They will explore creativity as an essential human pursuit and the techniques that can be implemented to enhance everyday creativity. Design is introduced as a means of instantiating creativity into products that are both original and useful.

Media and Society


This unit explores ways in which media influences our interpretation of the world and our place in it. The unit focuses on the ways in which ideas are constructed and communicated and promote dominant cultural values. Learning will be applied to the production of narrative video as a communications medium.

International Relations

In this unit, students examine issues relating to international relations and the way these issues are currently discussed and presented in contemporary media and social environments. Students are introduced to techniques and practices that develop confident and engaging speakers, who are able to present on the issues relating to international relations in English.

International Studies

This unit will provide students with authentic insights into the ways in which their discipline is undertaken in an Australian context through industry lectures, site visits and other discipline engagement. Students will undertake a specialist program that enables them to understand and critically evaluate how cultural factors influence the ways disciplines are approached in different global contexts.

Postgraduate Research Program Units

Research Design

This unit develops students' knowledge and skills in undertaking a master by research or PhD. Topics include qualitative, quantitative and mixed methods research, data collection and analysis techniques, and tools for thinking critically about research.

Research Writing

This unit develops students' abilities to effectively communicate their research in writing. It provides an understanding of the practice of research writing, and focuses on critical reading and writing, use of evidence and argument, and structuring research writing.

Research Communication

This unit provides students with skills to effectively present their research to different audiences (academic, government, and general population) and in different situations (conferences, elevator pitch, and social media). The unit develops an understanding of research application, impact and engagement, and helps students develop appropriate communication strategies to 'tell their research story'.

Experiencing Australia Program

Every Tailored Study Abroad Program includes ECU's award-winning Experiencing Australia Program (EAP), which focuses on experiential learning through social and cultural engagement. The EAP includes Buddy Ambassador support, which links ECU student volunteers and Study Abroad students. Together, they attend off-campus events to iconic Perth locations, as well as additional on-campus activities, like movie nights, quizzes and festivals. Their interactions throughout the EAP build relationships that further student success, as program participants become part of the university and wider community. Accommodation

Partners are encouraged to research and identify suitable accommodation in Perth early in their planning for a Study Abroad program as accommodation demand is high. Our campuses are all conveniently accessible by public transport.

Contact

Chat with ECU about the proposed program so that we can establish our ability to run it effectively. This takes into consideration dates, duration, student numbers, resources, etc.

Negotiation

Agree to the terms of the contract in writing. ECU will then draft the agreement and reach out to our partner's preferred contact to review and ensure we can progress to full signature.

Agreement

This is an institution-to-institution agreement, which is a contract between both partners that agrees to the terms of the Tailored Study Abroad program for the inbound cohort.



Invoice

When all applications have been received, ECU will invoice the partner for the program. This means that students pay their home institution directly and the institution/partner pays the ECU invoice.

Application

Students apply for the Tailored Study Abroad program directly online or via an ECU representative (agent). They select the course code X01 for undergraduate or X02 for postgraduate, and upload supporting documents.

Development

ECU plans for the arrival of the cohort of students, in communication with all parties, including the partner, academic staff, and ECC. This also involves the recruitment of ECU student volunteers to support the program.

Arrival

Students are greeted at the airport by ECU on arrival. They are guided to their accommodation, where they undertake check-in. The next day, Orientation commences.

Hear from ECU partners

Tokyo City University (TCU) has been collaborating with ECU since 2015. At TCU, our vision was always clear: to significantly increase overseas academic opportunities for our students. ECU met this with equal ambition and together we built the Tokyo City University Australia Study Abroad Program, which has given nearly 900 TCU students a tailored international study experience.

The specialised program offers a carefully balanced mix of English, Academic, and Social & Cultural components. Our students learn English alongside other international cohorts; they complete academic classes that are credited to their Japanese degree and they have the opportunity to integrate with ECU students through the Experiencing Australia Buddy Program and the Language Exchange Program.

Joondalup Campus

Located in the thriving cultural hub of Mount Lawley and close to Perth's Central Business District, you can't help but be inspired by the artistic vibe at this campus.


Here, you'll find one of the world's leading performing arts academies, the Western Australian Academy of Performing Arts. Plus an array of arts and humanities courses.

The campus is also home to Kurongkurl Katitjin, ECU's Centre for Indigenous Australian Education and Research.

ECU South West

Located two hours' drive south of Perth, ECU South West in Bunbury is the largest university campus in regional Western Australia.

Here, you can expect small, personalised class sizes and courses in science, health sciences, nursing, social work and teacher education. The campus features a café, mini-gym, crèche facilities, multi-purpose sports courts, and a library with 24-hour access to a computer lab.

Life as a student

Studying at university is like a whole new world for many students. The good news is, no matter what the study challenges of our students, we're ready to help them succeed.

Adjusting to study whatever your situation

At ECU, we support our students through their studies whatever their personal circumstances. This includes if they have a medical condition or disability or have responsibilities for caring for a family member in a similar situation.

It might also include ensuring they can continue to observe any cultural or religious practices.

Our Access and Inclusion team will work with them to identify reasonable adjustments to their study and uni life. We also provide ongoing support to them through an individual Learning Access Plan.

Adjusting to academic life

Learning at university can be a bit daunting to begin with, but we've got our students covered whatever help they need.

That includes help with preparing assignments, help with researching or referencing, help with online study and loads more. Students even get a peer mentor in their first semester!

Career advice and job skills

We offer support and resources to help students plan their future career, as well as find work or volunteering experience while they're a student.

This includes career-based workshops, industry events, one-to-one career advice and more.

Free counselling service

If they need to discuss any personal issues that may be affecting their ability to study, our students can access a free, professional and confidential psychological counselling service.

Sports and gyms

Being physically active positively stimulates the student brain and helps reduce the stress of assignment deadlines or exams.

So, it's a good thing that our campuses have terrific sports and gym facilities. Students can also join group fitness classes, social sports teams or attend regular healthy activities like yoga classes.

Student health services

The ECU campuses in Joondalup and Mount Lawley have student health centres with doctors (GPs), and nurses to assist students if they need them. The services are covered by Medicare or Overseas Student Health Funds so most visits are free or low cost.
