



Vietnam Natural Sciences Project

Two weeks between 23 July and 26 October 2018

Sign up for an extraordinary experience in Vietnam!

In this program, undergraduate students will undertake a project, involving an international experience, relevant to an environmental discipline associated with their course of study. Students will have the opportunity to draw together theory and practical experience on current environmental issues of importance to Vietnam, within the historical, economic, political and social context.

The project is comprised of a two-week visit to Thai Nguyen University (TNU).

Students will be involved in data collection and analysis as part of an ongoing collaborative research project between ECU and TNU. Students will work with Vietnamese students under the tutelage of Australian and Vietnamese Academics. The assessment (a report based on investigations conducted during the visit) will fulfil the requirements of the third year undergraduate research unit associated with their course of study.

Students will gain credit towards their degree through Natural Sciences Project Unit (SCI3120).

There are three places available. The Australian Government, through the New Colombo Plan Mobility Program, is supporting this tour, and eligible students will receive \$3,000 to assist with their program costs. Students selected must be Australian citizens and will be ambassadors for Australia. Under the funding program, the tour is open to students over the age of 18 years, however, 70% of students must be under 28 years old. Please note that this age restriction does not apply to Indigenous students.

Applications open on 16 April 2018 and close on 1 June 2018.
