## Profile

Professor Maryam Omari is the Executive Dean of the School of Business and Law. She has over 20 years of work experience in academia. ## **Towards Dignity and Respect at Work**

Many, and varied labels have been used to describe negative and inappropriate workplace behaviours, with power, persistence and harm to the victim being central to most. In recent years increasing attention has been paid to negative workplace behaviours, including bullying. However, as the information base grows, new gaps in knowledge emerge. Broad perspectives are needed to capture some of the diversity associated with the study of inappropriate and negative workplace behaviours, especially in a globalised world and in multicultural societies.
