

## HAT PPA6250 PLANNING GUIDELINES - SEMESTER 2, 2025

HAT Pre-service Teachers are required to prepare all relevant documentation according to the timelines provided below. Planning documents should be flexible working documents, the purpose of which is to underpin sound teaching which meets the needs of all students. Mentor Teachers should monitor Professional Experience Files to ensure that the appropriate level of detail and standard of presentation is maintained. These documents must be readily available at school at all times.

It is anticipated that PsTs will continue to plan and teach according to their contractual arrangements during the 5-week block. Planning documents as detailed below are the minimum requirements to meet the criteria for assessment of Professional Experience.
By Monday of Week 3	Planning documents	1 x Forward Planning Document for a focus class. The forward plan needs to be prepared on the template provided. Content, learning area and sequence of learning is at the discretion of the Mentor Teacher and should be designed to reflect the ongoing learning program in place for the students in the focus class. The FPD for assessment should include, at a minimum, the lessons to be delivered during the 5-week block, but can include all term planning if needed.  All other forward planning requirements should continue as per the format and process required for the school context. PsTs are not required to provide their planning documents
