Housed in a metal box, the cards serve as an archive for Pedersen's performances. This exhibition features nearly 70 index cards displayed with watercolour paintings and prints made during same period, alongside multiple live musical events where musicians interpret the scores, activating the space. As part his ongoing project, Pedersen will continually add new index cards to the exhibition, contributing to the evolving body of work.

Biography

Craig Pedersen is a trumpet player, composer and improvisor recently moved to Boorloo/Perth from Tiohtià:ke/Montreal. He has performed with Toshimaru Nakamura, Tetuzi Akiyama, Joe Morris, Godspeed You! Black Emperor, Joane Hetu, Jean Derome, Pauline Oliveros, and many others. In addition to performing in his own groups, The Craig Pedersen Quartet and Sound of the Mountain, he has been the trumpet player for Ensemble SuperMusique, a new music ensemble in Montreal dedicated to the performance of graphic and conceptual scores. An active touring artist, he has performed across Canada and Australia, in the USA, Mexico, Japan, Taiwan, Malaysia and Singapore.


Although his practice is based primarily in sound, as co-artistic director for the record label Mystery & Wonder, he has been responsible for art, design and manufacturing of a number of albums, many of which contain his own paintings and photographs.

He is currently involved in a multi-year research project into the limits of text score writing, soliciting creative input from Manfred Werder, Ryoko Akama, Heather Roche, Julián Galay, Gudinni Cortina, E Millar, Zhao Cong and Zhu Wenbo and Mark Molnar and many others. His current research at WAAPA focuses on understanding interpretation of conceptual text scores.
